Don Ripper won the bottle of wine.

Our Speaker Rich Langham. Rich started by talking about Café 123, where his wife Julie is the 'beating heart'. He said that Julie was sorry that she was unable to be here tonight. Café 123 has been going 4 and a half years. They have been helped by a wide variety of people, including students and young people, to bring this project to fruition, and community has been developed as they have worked together.

Rich and Julie are very concerned for young people who are not aware of their value/worth and who are lacking a sense of purpose and identity. Some of these young people exhibit extreme behaviours and do not cope in other environments, but are different when in the café environment. Sometimes they have experienced racism, or are not coping with the expectations placed on them. Café 123 is about valuing people, and empowering them to be the people they want to be.

25 young people from Sale College do shifts at the café each week. These generally have had issues with disengagement, causing disruption, or school refusal. They also have volunteers from the disabled sector – generally reasonably high functioning. 4 of these have made amazing progression. The third group being helped is women aged 55-65 years who need to either 20 hours work or voluntary work to meet Centrelink requirements. Many of these women are really struggling and find the café a supportive environment where they can gain skills and confidence.

The café is also used by groups after hours, including a very large craft/knitting group.

Financially the café pulls in about \$400-/day, really needs \$600-. Julie only gets paid for 5 hours/day, but puts in much more. Grants are very important, they recently got one from the Freemasons to renew the coffee machine.

The Factory is a newer project, about one year old. It is a community automotive workshop at 120 Foster Street. Rich is a trained mechanic who is currently earning an income by fixing cars whilst at the same time helping others who can't afford to pay a mechanic to fix their cars/motorbikes. He has resigned from his Chaplaincy and Anglican diocese jobs.

He is very aware of the vulnerability of these projects depending so heavily on him and Julie, but doesn't see a way around this at present. He does believe that we need to be encouraging entrepreneurs to start social enterprises as they have the skills and enthusiasm to build community capacity.

Rich answered members questions before being thanked by President Raj and presented with a gift pen.
